PHILOSOPHY

Arvon Township School believes that all students can learn essential skills at each grade level, regardless of family background, socioeconomic level, or gender. We believe that the small multiage environment of Arvon Township School offers collaborative learning opportunities. It provides younger students with more exposure to higher-level concepts and older students with reinforcement of previous learned skills.

5. ATS personnel, in support of school improvement efforts, will apply current technologies for information management, data collection and communications.

These goals will be accomplished with ongoing curriculum and staff development, parental and community support, and a commitment to use up-dated materials in the core curriculum

Educational subjects for the 2017-2018 school year included:

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING STUDENTS

Arvon Township School (ATS) is the only school in our district and receives all of the students within the township boundaries from K-6 grade. Families may elect to send their children to another district under Schools of Choice. In the September 2017 student count, fourteen elementary students were attending ATS. Students in grades 7-12 have the option of attending either L'Anse or Baraga Schools. Our program includes:

Michigan School Scorecards replaced previous AYP reports as the indicator of school and district compliance, assessment participation and assessment performance requirements in fulfillment of Michigan's approved ESEA Flexibility. Arvon Township School received a "green" score at both the district and school level.

AHERA MANAGEMENT PLAN

Arvon Township School District maintains a current Management Plan on the status of asbestos containing material (ACM) in its school building. This meets the requirements by the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act. Periodic surveillance of the facility is conducted to determine any changes in the ACM. Re-inspections are conducted on a threeyear cycle. The last re-inspection occurred in summer, 2016. No planned response actions are necessary or planned. STATUS OF CORE CURRICULUM

Arvon Township School implemented Michigan Standards for Mathematics, ELA, Social Studies and Science.

Language Arts

Students progressed in all areas of language arts: reading, speaking, listening, and spelling. Student writing samples were displayed during all school sponsored events incorporating a variety of technology applications learned in the classroom. ATS uses DIBELS monitoring to assess and progress monitor students in reading and utilizes the Read Naturally Program to provide additional reading support in the classroom. AIMS web is used to benchmark test and progress monitor students in writing and spelling.

<u>Science</u>

Students engaged in hands on inquiry-based science education. Themes incorporate life, physical, earth and environmental sciences. Students are regularly engaged in the scientific method. Students in grades 4-6 may participate in the Western Upper Peninsula Science Fair.

Mathematics

Students are engaged in daily problem solving and hands-on activities. Mathematics skills and concepts were applied to real world situations. Skills, vocabulary and concepts were also reinforced and integrated across curriculum areas such as physical education, art, social studies and science. Computer programs enrich learning in mathematics. AIMS web is used to benchmark test and progress monitor students in mathematics.

Social Studies

Students studied units covering geography, economics, civics, history and inquiry. Michigan History is studied as part of the third/fourth grade curriculum.

<u>Music</u>

Arvon Township students attended weekly music classes where they learned how to read music, sing, dance, and play various instruments.

<u>Art</u>

Arvon students participated in weekly art classes. The curriculum was organized around the principles of design; balance, contrast, emphasis, movement, pattern, rhythm, and unity. Students displayed multiple creations at the Arvon Town Hall during the Spring Program. Creativity and appreciation for the arts was highly integrated throughout the day.

Technology

Michigan Educational Technology Standards are integrated throughout the content areas to support learning through application of skills and knowledge of current technologies.

Spanish

Through a federal grant program, students attended a weekly Spanish class where they learn about the Spanish language, culture and history.

Physical Education and Health

Students participated in the EPEC physical education program for 60 minutes each week. Health lessons were also taught from the Michigan Health Model. A variety of healthy practices were promoted throughout the day including, movement, proper hygiene and nutrition.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Conferences were held in October to write and revise Individual Learning Plans and update parents on student progress. Conferences are scheduled at the end of the third marking period at teacher's discretion. Telephone conferences and/or special conferences were held with parents upon request. 100% of families participated.

Throughout the year our monthly newsletter, The Arvon Update, was sent home to inform parents of upcoming school related events. Phone calls were made, parent/teacher meetings were held and notes were issued as needed.

SPECIALIZED SCHOOLS

The Copper Country Intermediate School District Learning Center in Hancock provides a Special Education Program for severely impaired children within the district. This program offers interactive classroom activities, specialized equipment and supportive services for children in a larger geographic area to better meet their specific needs.

Special Education Programs are also available to eligible students through the L'Anse and Baraga school districts. Students participate in activities to the extent of their abilities and are provided transportation to participate in these programs.

Those students at Arvon with specific learning needs are assisted through individualized learning programs, flexible grouping, lessons based on need, one-on-one tutoring, Classroom Aide, learning disabled resources, school social work, teacher/parent consultations, ISD and other support services.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS

M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress)

Arvon Township School administered statewide assessments called M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress). These tests are taken online and measure current student knowledge. The M-STEP assesses student learning on Michigan's standards in mathematics, English language arts, science and social studies.

All grades 3-6 are assessed in ELA and mathematics each year. In addition, 5^{th} grade students are assessed in science and social studies.

During the 2017-18 school year the number of students enrolled in ATS within the tested grades was less than ten; therefore, statistical averages for each area cannot be published without compromising student confidentiality.
